Resolution In Support of Lowering the Compulsory School Age

Whereas, Pennsylvania's compulsory school attendance age allows children to wait until age 8 to enroll in school; and

Whereas, The Commonwealth's compulsory school age was established in 1895 and does not reflect the needs of children or families in the 21st century; and

Whereas, Pennsylvania is just one of two states in the nation (the other being Washington state) that permit children to wait until age 8 to enter school; and

Whereas, Lowering the compulsory school age would bring Pennsylvania in line with the vast majority of other states; and

Whereas, Research suggests that an early start in formal schooling can help improve language and literacy skills, increase student achievement, enhance social and emotional skill development, and decrease the need for remediation in later years; now therefore be it

Resolved: That the members of the State Board of Education support lowering the Commonwealth's compulsory school age from age 8 to age 6.
